




AWARD CATEGORIES

The Macleay Valley Business Awards provides an exceptional opportunity to recognise and reward amazing businesses whose passion, determination and success inspire other businesses and business people.

The Macleay Valley Business Awards are about more than just winning. They are the perfect opportunity for entrants to take a fresh look at their operation and have it assessed by experts. The process of completing an award application helps you to review your performance and think about your future plans.

There are two distinct Award Levels available:

LOCAL RECOGNITION AWARDS

All Entrants MUST enter one of the Local Recognition Awards.

Entrants can enter only ONE Local Recognition Awards. A list of the types of businesses who are eligible for each category is included in this Handbook.

EXCELLENCE AWARDS ALIGNED TO THE NSW BUSINESS CHAMBER

Entrants are encouraged to enter one of the NSW Business Chamber Aligned Awards.

Businesses and organisations can enter into more than one category of the NSW Business Chamber Aligned Awards.



LOCAL RECOGNITION AWARDS

These awards will be judged by an independent panel of experts combined with a public voting score to determine the winner in each category.

EXCELLENCE IN TOURISM, ACCOMMODATION AND HOSPITALITY

This award recognises an individual or business who has exhibited dedication to develop the visitor economy in the Macleay Valley. It also recognises excellence in service, facilities and entertainment available to the local community and guests in our region.

EXCELLENCE IN HEALTH, BEAUTY AND WELLBEING

This Award recognises excellence in businesses providing "feel good" services and recognises the health intervention measures and facilities which help to improve quality of life, making a real difference to the wellbeing of our community.

EXCELLENCE IN RETAIL SERVICE

This award recognises businesses or organisations who can demonstrate excellence in their business planning and practices plus show continued development and innovation in their business.

EXCELLENCE IN PROFESSIONAL SERVICE

- 20 or Less Employees

This award recognises businesses with 20 or less employees, that possess specialist knowledge, skills & products that adhere to ethical standards and have been derived from a high level of education, training and experience.

EXCELLENCE IN PROFESSIONAL SERVICE

- 21 or More Employees

This award recognises businesses with 21 or more employees, that possess specialist knowledge, skills & products that adhere to ethical standards and have been derived from a high level of education, training and experience.

EXCELLENCE IN TRADES & INDUSTRY

This award recognises businesses that possess specialist trades, skills & products that adhere to ethical standards and have been derived from a trades certificate, training and experience.

EXCELLENCE IN AGRICULTURE

This Award recognises an individual or business who has contributed to the development of all areas of agribusiness and value add food services across the Macleay Valley. It also recognises key achievements in the industry and honours key people who drive this sector.





NSW CHAMBER ALIGNED AWARDS

These awards will be judged by an independent panel of experts and the winner in each category will be nominated for the NSW Business Chamber Regional Awards.

OUTSTANDING EMPLOYEE

The Outstanding Employee Award recognises an inspirational employee who has demonstrated a passion for their role and a commitment to their workplace and the community.

OUTSTANDING YOUNG BUSINESS LEADER

The Outstanding Young Business Leader Award recognises an inspirational business leader aged 35 or under who has demonstrated a commitment to their workplace, industry and the community through leadership.

OUTSTANDING BUSINESS LEADER

The Outstanding Business Leader Award recognises an inspirational business leader aged 36 years or over who has demonstrated a commitment to their workplace, industry and the community through leadership, whilst providing mentorship to others.

EMPLOYER OF CHOICE

The Employer of Choice Award recognises a business that has implemented strategies and initiatives to create stimulating and supportive workplace environments for its employees.

EXCELLENCE IN INNOVATION

The Excellence in Innovation Award recognises a business that has implemented innovative solutions for new and existing business needs through the introduction or improvement of an idea, product, method, technology, process or application.

EXCELLENCE IN SUSTAINABILITY

The Excellence in Sustainability Award recognises a business that has demonstrated its commitment to sustainable business practices and is working to reduce the impact of its operations on the environment.

OUTSTANDING COMMUNITY ORGANISATION

The Outstanding Community Organisation Award recognises an organisation that works to improve the social, cultural or environmental wellbeing of the community.

OUTSTANDING START-UP

The Outstanding Start-up Award recognises a start-up business that has effectively driven growth and is able to demonstrate the potential to achieve future success.

EXCELLENCE IN DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION

This Excellence in Diversity and Inclusion Award recognises businesses that address the needs of a diverse community, including seniors, people from Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) backgrounds, and people with disability. An inclusive business facilitates the needs of all its employees and customers.

EXCELLENCE IN MICRO BUSINESS LESS THAN 5 EMPLOYEES

The Excellence in Micro Business Award recognises a business that has effectively driven growth and is able to demonstrate the specific strategies implemented to achieve business success and/or resilience.

EXCELLENCE IN SMALL BUSINESS 5 · 20 EMPLOYEES

The Excellence in Small Business Award recognises a business that has effectively driven growth and is able to demonstrate the specific strategies implemented to achieve business success and/or resilience.

EXCELLENCE IN BUSINESS MORE THAN 21 EMPLOYEES

The Excellence in Large Business Award recognises a business that has effectively driven growth and is able to demonstrate the specific strategies implemented to achieve business success and/or resilience.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. Eligibility for Entrants

To be eligible to submit an application you should be a Member of a local business chamber or the NSW Business Chamber or be prepared to join the Macleay Valley Business Chamber.

A business must enter ONE of the Local Recognition Award categories and is encourage to enter one or more of the NSW Business Chamber Aligned awards.

Members of the NSW Business Chamber Executive cannot enter into an individual award however, they can enter their business into one of the other categories.

2. Eligibility for Voting in Local Recognition Awards

Any individual or business can vote for a Local Recognition Applicant.

There can be only one vote per IP address lodged. You can vote for all Entrants if you wish however you can only vote for a single entrant once.

3. Judging Process

A panel of independent experts will assess all entries to the Awards utilising a scoring system adopted by the NSW Business Chamber.

The judges will be recruited from outside the region.

All information supplied to the judging panel will remain confidential.

The decision of the judges will be final.

4. Confidentiality

All information supplied by an Entrant will remain confidential however each Entrant will be asked to supply a 100 word description of their business that be used for promotional purposes by the Chamber. By entering the Awards, you agree to have this information used for promotional purposes.

5. Social Media

The Macleay Valley Business Chamber will undertake a major social media campaign to promote the Awards through Facebook, Instagram and online. By submitting an application you agree that Macleay Valley Business Chamber can use the 100-word biography of your business in our promotion of the event.

6. Communications

By submitting an Awards entry, an entrant understands and agrees that the Chamber or our Awards Sponsors may contact entrants in relation to the Awards process or promotions and that entrant contact information may be provided to other parties for this purpose.

- ✓ I have been employed by my current employer for at least 18 months at the time of entry.
- ✓ I am not an employee, Regional President, State Councillor or Board Member of NSW Business Chamber Limited.

AWARD ELIGIBILITY CHECK BOX

✓ The business has been trading for a continuous period of two or more years and is not bankrupt or trading insolvent at the time of entry.

- 2. Describe why the innovation is unique within your industry and how it differentiates your business from its competitors. *Maximum word count: 300*

EXCELLENCE IN SUSTAINABILITY

The Excellence in Sustainability Award recognises a business that has demonstrated its commitment to sustainable business practices and is working to reduce the impact of its operations on the environment.

ENTRY CRITERIA

Entrants are required to demonstrate their achievements over the past 12 months across the key area of environmental sustainability. Category criteria are based on initiatives and projects executed within the business not related to its core offering.

AWARD ELIGIBILITY CHECK BOX

- ✓ The business has been trading for a continuous period of two years or more and is not bankrupt or trading insolvent at the time of entry.
- ✓ Sustainability cannot be your core business

- 1. Outline your business sustainability goals and objectives including measurable targets. *Maximum word count: 200*
- 2. Outline the initiatives you have implemented to achieve sustainable practices within your business. *Maximum word count: 300*
- 3. Describe your sustainability achievements over the past 12 months including environmental outcomes. Maximum word count: 300
- 4. Describe how you involve your workforce and external stakeholders in your sustainability initiatives. *Maximum word count: 400*

OUTSTANDING COMMUNITY ORGANISATION

The Outstanding Community Organisation Award recognises an organisation that works to improve the social, cultural or environmental wellbeing of the community.

ENTRY CRITERIA

Entrants are required to demonstrate their commitment over the past 12 months to being an outstanding community organisation. This category is open to social enterprises and not-for-profit organisations that have been trading for a period of over 24 months.

AWARD ELIGIBILITY CHECK BOX

- ✓ The organisation has been trading for a continuous period of two or more years and is not bankrupt or trading insolvent at the time of entry.
- ✓ The organisation has not entered the categories of Outstanding Start-up, Excellence in Micro Business, Excellence in Small Business or Excellence in Business.

- 1. Explain the social purpose of your organisation and how it contributes to the social, cultural or environmental wellbeing of the community. *Maximum word count: 300*
- 2. Provide an overview of your organisation, including the product or service you deliver within the community. *Maximum word count: 200*
- 3. Provide an overview of the key features of your business development strategy and projected outcomes for the future. *Maximum word count: 300*
- 4. Demonstrate how your organisation contributes to the local economy in your region. *Maximum word count: 400*

OUTSTANDING START-UP

The Outstanding Start-up Award recognises a start-up business that has effectively driven growth and is able to demonstrate the potential to achieve future success.

ENTRY CRITERIA

Entrants are required to demonstrate their commitment over the past 12 months to being an outstanding start-up. This category is open to new businesses trading for a period of less than 24 months.

AWARD ELIGIBILITY CHECK BOX

- ✓ This business has been trading for a period of less than two years and is not bankrupt or trading insolvent at the time of entry.
- ✓ This business has not been purchased or acquired and is not part of a franchise.
- ✓ The business has not entered the categories of Outstanding Community Organisation, Excellence in Micro Business, Excellence in Small Business or Excellence in Business.

- 1. Provide an overview of your start-up business including the product or service delivered to the market, how you identified it as a market need and who your target customer is. *Maximum word count: 200*
- 2. Provide an overview of the key features of your business development strategy and projected outcomes for the future. *Maximum word count: 300*
- 3. Describe why your product or service offering is unique within your industry and differentiates your business from competitors. *Maximum word count: 300*
- Detail the measurable growth and key milestones you have achieved since launching your business. Maximum word count: 400
- 5. Describe the key challenges your business has faced as a start-up and how you overcame them. *Maximum word count: 400*





EXCELLENCE IN DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION

This Excellence in Diversity and Inclusion Award recognises businesses that address the needs of a diverse community, including seniors, people from Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) backgrounds, and people with disability. An inclusive business facilitates the needs of all its employees and customers.

ENTRY CRITERIA

Entrants are required to demonstrate their commitment over the past 12 months to address the needs of a diverse community. This category is open to businesses that have been trading for a continuous period of two or more years.

AWARD ELIGIBILITY CHECK BOX

✓ The organisation has been trading for a continuous period of two or more years and is not bankrupt or trading insolvent at the time of entry.

- 1. Outline your current staff level and diversity including employees with disability, older people (over 55), women, young people (18-24 years), Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and people from CALD backgrounds. *Maximum word count: 200*
- 2. Identify and describe your positive and/or proactive inclusive practices within the business that go beyond regulatory compliance. *Maximum word count: 350*
- 3. Describe your HR and employment hiring practices that demonstrate your commitment to being an inclusive employer. *Maximum word count: 350*
- 4. Identify and describe how your business has created an accessible and inclusive environment that is welcoming for customers with a disability, seniors and people from CALD backgrounds.

 *Maximum word count: 400**
